REGIONAL SPOTLIGHT: NORTH EAST

I have been a Parent Educator for 5 years but this past fall is the first time I had served a BFG family. I had the opportunity to get to know the family throughout 7 virtual visits. During the beginning of our visits, Mom mentioned how they didn't have any books in the home for her 2 children as we were discussing early literacy. The next week, I sent the family 2 boxes of activities, handouts, and books for both children. Mom reported back to me that her daughter loved the books and since receiving the books, she always asks mom to read to her everyday.

Although it may seem like a small gesture, I know the interaction with mom reading the books to her children is a big step in both their parent & child interaction, as well as introduction to early literacy.

Although it is a challenge to work with a family that lived far enough away that I would never be able to meet them in person, I believe an impact was made on both the family and myself.
