### REGIONAL SPOTLIGHT: KANSAS CITY

I am a new educator to PAT and this BF family referral came to me as one of my very first families to visit. I was nervous about working with a teen mom and felt a lack of confidence in making a connection with the family as I worked alongside them. I surprisingly and quickly developed a rapport with this mom, who felt that she could communicate with me in times of stress. This connection allowed me to help her problem solve recently. Transportation is a large barrier for this family- they had no working car and had trouble making any appointment for a ride through medicaid transit. She reached out to me, we discussed the options & stressed to her how important it was to make it to this appointment as her baby has a heart condition. After partnering with CPS, she was able to secure a ride. Mom reported good news from the Dr but that she had accidentally left the baby's heart monitor at the hospital. I was able to provide the phone number of the social worker at the hospital and through a great deal of teamwork, the monitor was located and returned to the family. This experience built her confidence in her problem solving and competency as a parent. I'm grateful for the opportunity to be working with this family during this season of their lives and to see this mother grow in her parenthood through this experience.
