REGIONAL SPOTLIGHT: SUSAN WEST- SOUTH EAST

I enrolled a family involved with Bright Futures in April of 2020. While she wasn't sure why I was calling, from day one, she was very receptive to receiving services from Parents as Teachers. She had very low selfesteem and felt that people doubted her ability to be a good mother. She was determined to prove to herself and others that she could be an excellent mother. Her disabilities have made everyday tasks difficult, but she still manages to be very attentive to her son's needs, regardless of the pain that it causes her. Our visits are still virtual, but she always makes me feel that I'm right there by moving around in the house to show me his bedroom, new toys, books, etc...

She loves singing, reading and playing with her son and takes the information that I share with her and applies it. Dad is also involved and has attended almost every visit. We are continuing to do weekly visits at the request of the family. I wish that all of my families were as involved as her.
