### **Bright Futures Success Story**

When the family started seeing PAT, they had two children enrolled in the program, a newborn, a three year old, and an older child who was too old for the program. FEP started visiting family and during the visits, it became a family activity. Mom and the three children would engage in the activities and talk about what had happen between visits. Mom and the two older children would be around the younger child playing, and each would comment how the younger child would respond during activities. The oldest child, with mom's help, would read the book to everyone during visits. Dad would join us and participate in visits when his work schedule would allow. The family started coming to our Group Connections, and always said what a great time they had at the next home visit. As it became closer to the school year, mom struggled with the idea of sending her middle child to full day preschool. FEP supported mom and dad through their decision and had discussions on preschool readiness with the family. Mom and dad decided to send their middle child to preschool and have made a great connection with their child's teacher. At the last few visits. mom has discussed how the transition to preschool has gone better than she expected and has only good things to say about the preschool experience. Mom comments on how her child comes home and talks about the friends they made at school. With their child going to school, mom and dad decided to graduate their middle child out of PAT, and are happy with the supports their child has at school. FEP still meets with mom and the youngest child. Mom was so excited at the last visit to tell FEP that their youngest has started to roll from back to tummy. Mom, dad and grandpa have already been discussing the different ways they will be child proofing the home as the youngest becomes more mobile. Family has been very consistent with visits. Mom comments how the children look forward to the visits and asked to schedule a few visits throughout the year on days when school is closed to continue to include the whole family in visits


