SUCCESS STORY

Major success was getting [child1] to the EC screening and the ball rolling on Pre-K next year for her. [Child1] was flagged for a vision followup. That appointment has been scheduled and will happen next week. Mom is working to get immunizations up to date and has an appointment for that next week as well, for both kids getting immunizations. Mom was able to leave [child2] with dad for the screening and focus on [child1] and the report. PE met her there and supported her in the process. Another major goal met was enrolling to finish school. Mom took the initiative to find a second-hand computer and get enrolled in classes to finish her high school degree. Classes seem to be going well, a lot of review right now. [Child2] continues to receive speech services and will be checked by OT at next REACH (tiny-k) appointment. He continues to expand his wordlist at each visit. We were able to do a joint visit this month and hope to collaborate again in the future to ease mom's schedule. Family has instituted a relaxed routine of movie with dad when he gets home to ease stress in the home and connect as a family. Mom feels that [child1] is becoming more self-aware with her social-emotional purposeful teaching identifying feelings and modeling appropriate behaviors in managing them.

UPDATE FROM THE STATEHOUSE

From Kansas Action for Children:

Lawmakers began discussions on the K-12 budget early in the session, but waited until the very last day to pass a final bill. Waiting this long forces lawmakers to vote for legislation that combines harmful policy with crucial school funding. There is no time for more debate, no time to fix a bill, and no time to express objection to any of the numerous policies injected into a funding bill.

<u>House Sub. for SB 113</u> combines 11 different policy pieces with the Kansas Department of Education (KSDE) budget, leaving lawmakers in a difficult situation. For those who objected to the policy, they only had this bill as their option to fund K-12 public schools.

Base special education funding of \$520 million was inserted into the bill after lawmakers were unable to pass their voucher plan. This does not include the Governor's request for annual increases of \$72 million, leaving districts to fill the funding gap like they have been doing for years already.

While we outlined the details of the policies in the K-12 funding bill <u>last week</u>, a major change was made to gain votes. The "parent portal" piece of the legislation, requiring school districts to create a new section on their websites for all district approved curriculum, was removed. This change apparently made it more palatable for lawmakers as the bill passed the House 83-37 and the Senate 23-16. The bill is now on its way to the Governor.

We appreciate the contact that you made with your legislators and we encourage you to invite them to attend a home visit or a group connection as you strive to educate them about the importance of Kansas Parents as Teachers funding and the impact that home visiting has on families residing in Kansas communities!
