SUCCESS STORY

The family completed two years of service this month. The boys turned two in February and are progressing through their milestones.. Mom has routines in place and is consistent and intentional with time for active play and learning each day. She narrates her day for the boys and expands on what they tell her to encourage language development. She also makes an effort to get down level with them to understand their words. These are tools she learned through our PAT program. Both parents are incorporating regular outdoor time in their backyard as a family. Mom is staying home with the boys and occasionally working for her husband's business. The boys have had their regular well checks consistently throughout the two years of service. Mom recently applied for the renewal of the insurance for the twins. She reached out to Rainbows for an evaluation and possible visits to monitor one of the boy's language development, however, he is progressing now and she is not as concerned. Mom will have his hearing rechecked at the doctor's office in April. The family is considering transitioning to Early Head Start for regular visits if they do not receive services from Rainbows. We have explored various spaces in the community for outings and the family plans to continue to go on adventures together. They achieved numerous goals during their two years in the program including acquiring a high school diploma, starting college, finding childcare and moving into a home. Mom plans to return to college coursework when the boys are able to

Details of Training:

Child Abuse and Neglect: Recognition, Reporting & Supporting

Kansas law states that most professionals who work with children, including medical professionals, social workers, nurses, educators and others, are mandated reporters and are required by law to report suspicion of child abuse or neglect. This presentation will address areas of risk and protective factors, definitions of child abuse and neglect per Kansas law and provide examples of signs and symptoms. Participants will also learn the appropriate responses to suspected abuse or neglect, discuss what to do in the event of child disclosure and understand Kansas mandated reporter laws. This training is approved by KDHE for 1.0 child care licensing hours.


