BRIGHT FUTURES SUCCESSES

SUCCESS STORY

The family has participated fully in the Bright Futures Program for one year. They have become responsive and responsible parents and their child is thriving. [Mom] has grown in maturity and has been a stay at home mother who is nurturing and of her child's health supportive development and learning. She has a strong partner and a strong family support system. Her use of her medical home, WIC, and local health dept as partners is well developed and comfortable. This family intends to stay in the local PAT program after this case is closed. They are doing great and [child] is thriving. They have met with their parent educator 30 times for individualized instruction. They have made and met 3 goals and are working on 2 more. They have acted on 7 referrals and received services for them. They have also participated in 3 group meetings. [Child] has been completely screened twice: once on entry to the program and once recently. He is doing well.

Conversations about developmental screening results and concerns can be time-consuming and anxiety-provoking for families and for family-facing providers. Yet the benefits are clear: when families and their child's providers have productive conversations about a child's development, they are better equipped to work as a team to co-create and follow through on a collaborative plan that supports the best outcomes for the child. The Development is a Journey Conversation Roadmap was created to simplify, support, and strengthen these important and often challenging conversations. The Roadmap is designed to facilitate these conversations with seven short and simple steps to actively engage parents and other caregivers in planning for their child's developmental needs, and enhance the provider-parent partnership, especially when parents and providers find themselves having different perspectives about the child and the possible challenge. This webinar will introduce participants to this strengths-based, relationally-focused, family-centered tool and process for engaging families and providers in collaborative partnership to address developmental challenges in service of best outcomes for children and their caregivers. 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KPATA received the PATNC Challenge Grant for DEIA.

The short-term goals and opportunities for this grant include:

<u>Immediate Impact (within the first 6 months):</u>

- Customized offerings which would allow KPATA Staff and Affiliate parent educators as well as PAT Staff statewide (limited to 50 slots) to "choose their own adventure" to engage in a series of webinar, workshop, and discussion offerings to address a range of issues, including why DEIA is important, even where populations served are not racially diverse, the history of family-serving and other systems, such as child welfare, health, education, housing that impact children and families
- Engage parents, parent leaders, networks to understand home visiting from their perspective and the interactions and trainings they would find helpful for parent educators
- Staff growth, conversation, and planning for needs in response to book study and other components

<u>Eventual Impact (within the first year):</u>

- Opportunities for staff and Affiliate parent educators to engage in experiential learning with those from other communities to hear different perspectives and to deepen awareness of the backgrounds, cultures, and customs of other communities experiences brought back to professional role and community
- Panel sharing and in-depth discussion about information learned, vulnerabilities and continued growth at state conference
- Additional professional learning opportunities as determined by need following prior sessions
- Casual discussion in lunch and learn style that allows for questions and personal learning
